

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. You will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Sub-group growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed: 58% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts and 38% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state mathematics standards. Although the percentage of students meeting state academic standards just slightly increased when measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessments, the math growth of Battle Creek Elementary students, when compared to other students in Oregon with similar prior test scores, increased from the 30th to 48th percentile. The median growth in reading increased from 42nd to 44th. In the previous school year, each of the underserved student groups demonstrated increased growth, with the exception of students with

disabilities in reading. Improving the achievement of this student group continues to be an important goal for Battle Creek Elementary. Smarter Balanced Assessments for 2015-2016 show improvement in the math median growth for students in Special Education: An increase in math from 20th in 2014-2015 to 44th in 2015-2016 * English Language Arts showed a slight decrease from 31st in 2014-2015 to 29th in 2015-2016. The Battle Creek staff is committed to increasing the academic success of all students. Teachers have received additional training this past year implementing and delivering a new English Language Arts curriculum and creating positive behavior supports. We appreciate the involvement of parents and our school community. Together we will ensure our students are prepared for success in college and careers.

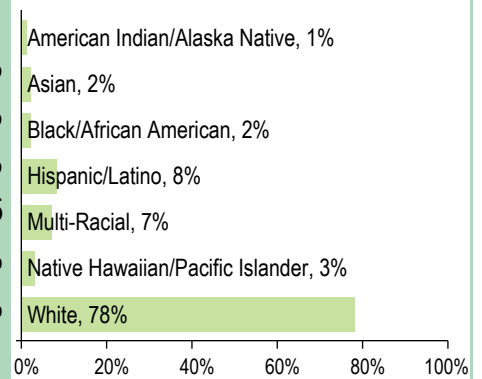

Percent of students without all required vaccines: 4

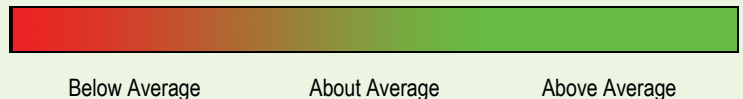
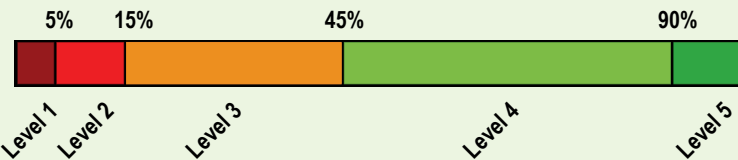
