

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past two years. However, you will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and specific-group growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed:

- 39% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts
- 33% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state mathematics standards

Although the percentage of students meeting state academic standards decreased when measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessments, the English Language Arts growth of Chávez elementary students, when compared to other students in Oregon with similar prior test scores,

increased from the 49th to 54th percentile. The growth in mathematics increased from 33rd to 36th. Smarter Balanced Assessments for 2015-2016 also show a slight improvement in growth for students in Special Education for English Language Arts- 42% to 44% - but a decrease in scores for math from 45% to 33%. Chávez Elementary staff are committed to increasing the academic success of all students so improving the achievement of this subgroup is an important goal for us. Teachers have received additional training this past year delivering reading curriculum and creating positive behavior supports. We appreciate the involvement of parents and our school community. Together we will ensure our students are prepared for success in college and careers.

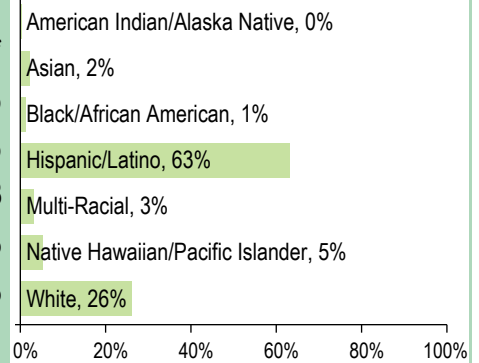

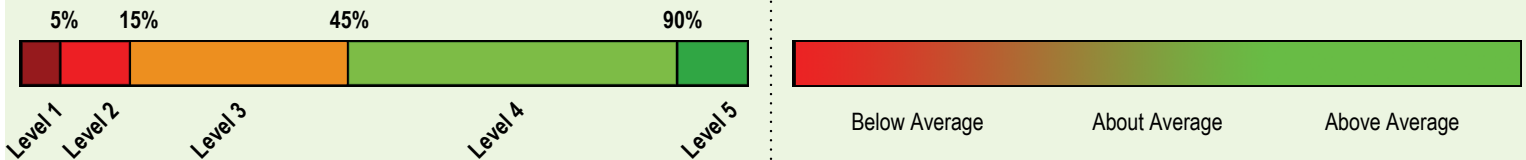
