The 2015-16 school year was another successful year for Gubser School. Our over 525 students worked hard to reach their potential and meet grade level standards.

Like all schools, Gubser was not given an overall rating by the state of Oregon for the '15-'16 school year. However, we are proud of the hard work of our kids, and are appreciative of the support and assistance we get from our parents and community. Our hard-working staff is highly effective and very dedicated to the success of each student. As you may know, our older students took the Smarter Balanced Assessments for the second year in a row. These tests are more challenging than the former OAKS testing. However, these new assessments better represent the complexity of skills our students will need to be successful in future schooling and in the workplace. Some highlights of test results from last year include:

About 60% of our students met/exceeded standards in English Language Arts
About 50% of our students met/exceeded standards in math
This year we will continue to implement the Common Core State Standards. We will continue to provide a positive school culture and climate and help teach and reinforce positive behavior and effective social skills. Our goal is to support all students to be the best students and citizens that they can be. We welcome the support of the community and look forward to this being a great year for Gubser Gators!

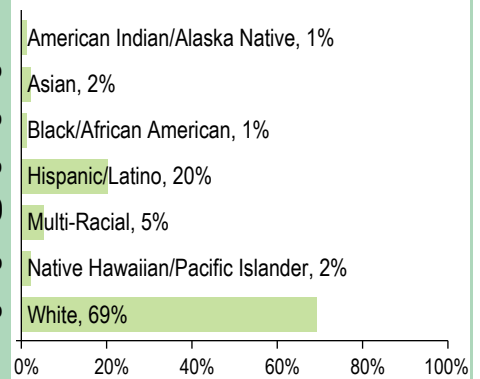

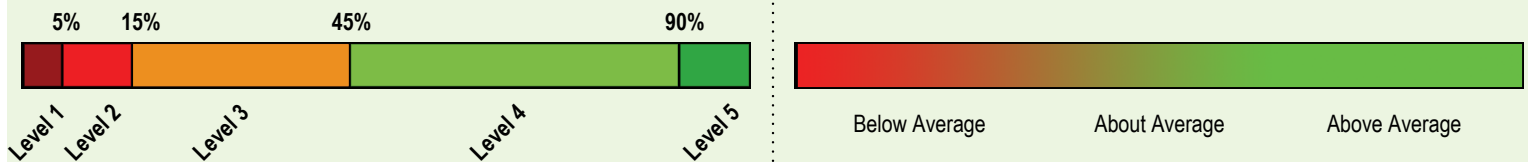
