

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, students in Oregon took the Smarter Balanced Assessments for the second year in a row. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past two years. However, you will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Sub-group growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed:

- * 44% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts
- * 36% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state mathematics standards

Although the percentage of students meeting state academic standards decreased when measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessments, the reading growth of Harritt Elementary students, when compared to other students in Oregon with similar prior test scores remained at the 50th percentile. The median growth in mathematics increased from 37th to 40th.

These scores suggest Harritt Elementary students have transitioned successfully from OAKS to the Smarter Balanced Assessments. In the previous school year, each of the historically underserved subgroups met growth indicator ratings in English Language Arts. We continue to monitor our subgroup indicator ratings in math with a focus on our students with disabilities and English learners. The Harritt staff is committed to increasing the academic success of all students. Teachers have received additional training this past year delivering reading curriculum and creating positive behavior supports. We appreciate the involvement of parents and our school community. Together we will ensure our students are prepared for success in college and careers. Please help your child maintain regular school attendance as this has a direct impact on student learning and measurable growth.

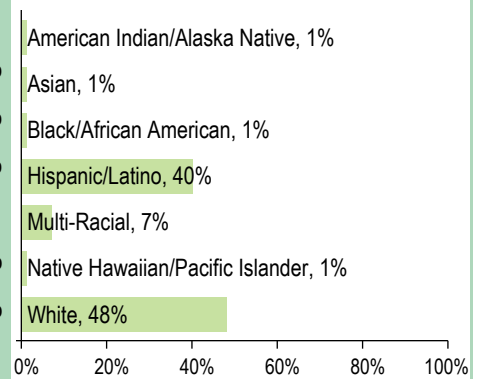

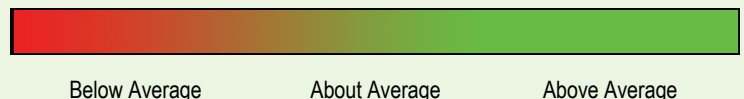
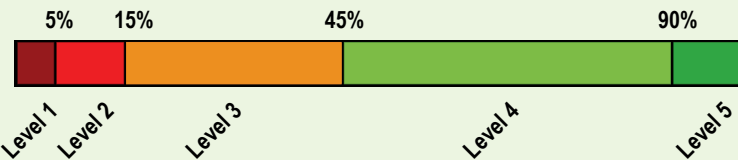
