

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past two years. However, you will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Sub-group growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments at Hoover showed 25% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts, and 15% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state mathematics standards. The English Language Arts growth of Hoover students, when compared to other students in Oregon, decreased from the 53rd to 45th percentile. However, the median growth in mathematics increased from 32nd to 42nd. Overall, the median growth for

historically underserved student groups decreased in English Language Arts, but increased in Math.

As a community, we have chosen to strengthen reading and math instruction by investing in on-going teacher training opportunities, motivating and engaging students in the learning process, and providing targeted interventions to students during the school day. We exist to ensure that your child has the skills necessary to graduate prepared for a career or college. You can partner with us by ensuring your child maintains 95% attendance, and taking advantage of the many opportunities to be involved as a parent at Hoover.

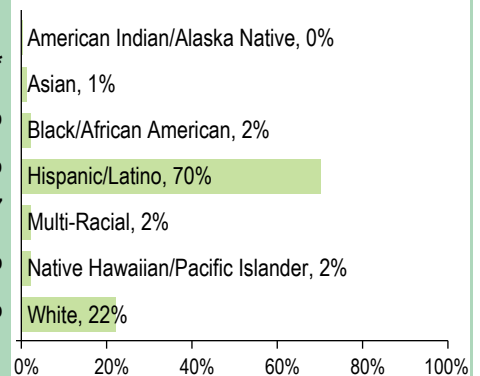

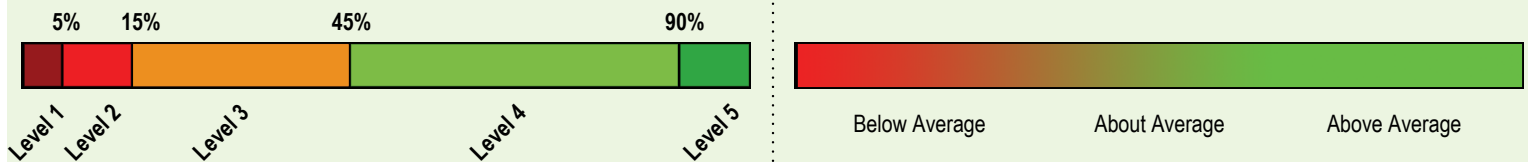
