#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, all students in the state took the Smarter Balanced Assessment. The Smarter Balanced Assessment replaced the OAKS assessment. The Smarter Balanced assessment is aligned with the new standards taught and is a more in-depth assessment. The new content standards set higher expectations for students. This means that expectations for student achievement are higher than they used to be. As a result, it is likely that fewer students will score at the higher achievement levels on the assessments, especially the first few years. Results should improve as students have more years of instruction based on the new standards.

Being the second year the assessment was given, no school received an overall State School Report Card Rating. However, you will see school wide results on the following pages but no overall ratings were given to schools this year.

Based on the results reported, this second year Houck Middle School reported:

- English Language Arts 36.4% met/exceeded state standards
- Mathematics 25.7% met/exceeded state standards

At Houck, our expectation is that all Houck students are able to meet or exceed state standards. In order to assist students to grow academically we will continue to provide support classes in both Language Arts and Math. We will also be focusing our staff professional development on how we can engage all students in rigorous tasks, empower students with problem solving skills and content knowledge, and expand each student's

ability to be a critical thinker. These skills will be foundational for student success on the Smarter Balanced Assessment and in future endeavors in life. Additionally, we will incorporate universal assessments and data driven intervention programs in math and language arts. We will interpret the data regularly to actively monitor student learning of Common Core Standards. This will allow us to make data informed decisions on student learning and address areas of concern in a timely manner.

As a parent, you can support your student by having your child read daily, monitoring your student's homework, and checking your student's planner every evening. If you have any questions or concerns when doing these tasks with your student, please call us so we can work together to support your student. Also, you can review your student's grades by signing up in the ParentVUE system.

We look forward to partnering with you and your student in order for your student to achieve our district vision: All students graduate and are prepared for a successful life.


