

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past two years. However, you will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Sub-group growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed:

- 76% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts
- 67% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state mathematics standards

This year Kalapuya Elementary has been given a 5 out of 5 rating for Academic Achievement, 5 out of 5 for Academic Growth, and 4 out of 5 for Student Group Growth.

We progress monitor students' levels and provide intervention and support for students who are struggling and also for students who are excelling. Our goal is to keep parents informed of their child's academic level and ways that they can support them at home.

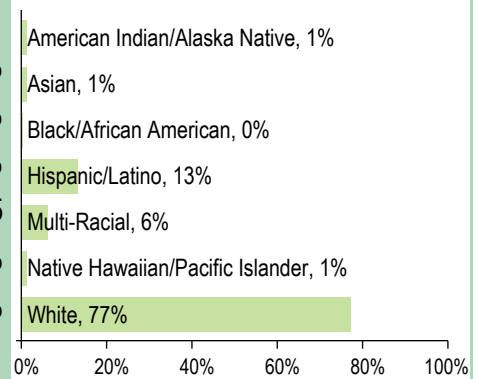

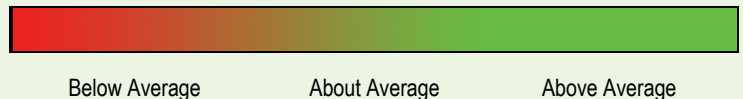
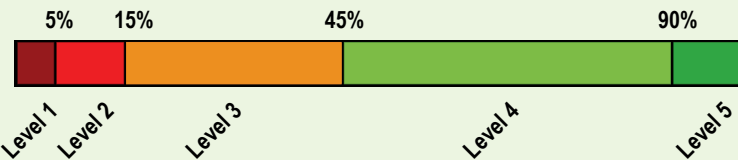
