

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past two years. However, you will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Sub-Group Growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed:

- 37.3% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts
- 34.2% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state mathematics standards

Although the percentage of students meeting state academic standards decreased when measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessments, the math growth of Keizer Elementary students, when compared to other students in Oregon with similar prior test scores, increased from the 44th to 51st percentile. The median growth in English Language Arts declined.

In the previous school year, each of the historically underserved subgroups have not met growth indicator ratings. Improving the achievement of these subgroups has been

an important goal for Keizer Elementary. Smarter Balanced Assessments for 2015-2016 show improvement in the median growth for:

- Economically Disadvantaged- an increase in mathematics from 44th in 2014-201 to 51st in 2015-2016
- Underserved Races/Ethnicities- an increase in mathematics from 44th in 2014-2015 to 47th in 2015-2016
- Students with Disabilities- an increase in mathematics from 37th in 2014-201 to 38th in 2015-2016

The Keizer Elementary staff is committed to increasing the academic success of all students. Teachers have received additional training this past year delivering reading curriculum and creating positive behavior supports. We appreciate the involvement of parents and our school community. Together we will ensure our students are prepared for success in college and careers.

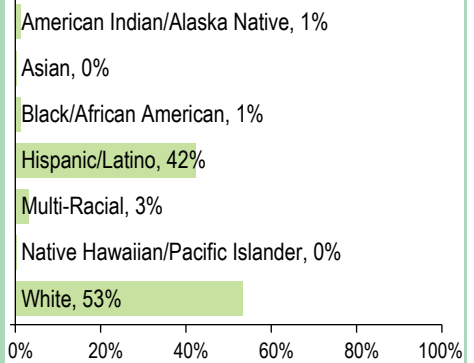

Percent of students without all required vaccines: 3

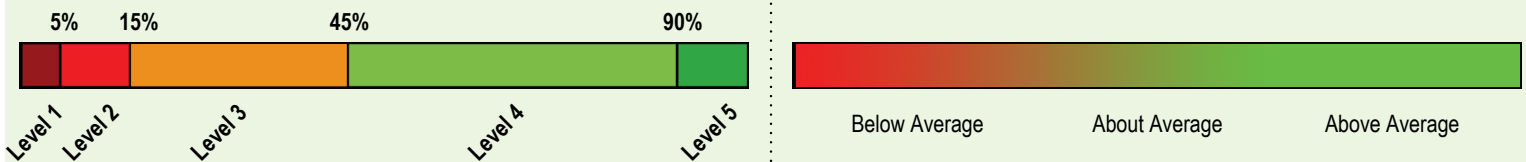

CURRICULUM & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT WHAT IS THIS SCHOOL DOING TO IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE?

SCHOOL READINESS

- There is a consistent positive behavior plan throughout the school.
- Students participate in 120 minutes of physical education each week.
- The attendance rate for Keizer Elementary students is 94%.
- A school counselor and school Behavior Specialist provide support for emotional, academic and behavioral needs.
- Breakfast and lunch are provided to all students at no cost to families.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- Keizer Elementary provides an Early Exit program of Spanish language support for students Kindergarten – Third Grade.
- Sheltered instruction and language development for speakers of other languages Kindergarten – Fifth Grade.
- Federal Title programs provide supplemental academic support.
- Individualized Educational Plans with appropriate language and academic supports are provided by Special Education staff for students with disabilities.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

- Individualized plans for enriched instruction are developed with parental input, for students identified as Talented and Gifted
- Focus on College and Career Readiness
- Career Fair Explorations
- Keizer Elementary students in grade 5 provided opportunity to compete in the District Math 24 Challenge
