

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

At Liberty Elementary, we have been focusing on instructing students in a manner that meets their individual needs as well as ensuring a deep implementation of the Common Core State Standards (CCSS). This is the second consecutive year of the usage of the State of Oregon's new Smarter Balanced Assessment for Literacy and Math administered to 3rd, 4th and 5th graders in the Spring. At this time Liberty Elementary, along with all other schools in the state of Oregon, received a "Not Rated" Overall State Report Card Rating. This is due to the few opportunities students have had in taking the new assessment. However, our school received ratings in each of the following categories:

- Academic Achievement: Level 3 - 60% points earned
- Academic Growth: Level 4 - 70.0% points earned
- Student Group Growth: Level 3 - 50.0% points earned

We have seen academic growth in our English Language Arts and math scores among all of our students. This is a celebration seeing our students achieve

academic growth. However, some of our subgroup data did not show the level of growth we expect. We will closely monitor the academic growth of our students to ensure that it continues to improve in this coming school year.

In summary, what these ratings mean is that our students are making academic growth. Continued academic growth means our students will be able to achieve grade level benchmark scores in the future.

Please continue being our partner in supporting your child's education by participating in school events, reading with your child every day, attending Parent-Teacher Conferences, and maintaining regular communication with your child's teacher.

Working together, we will make a difference and ensure the success of each of our students.

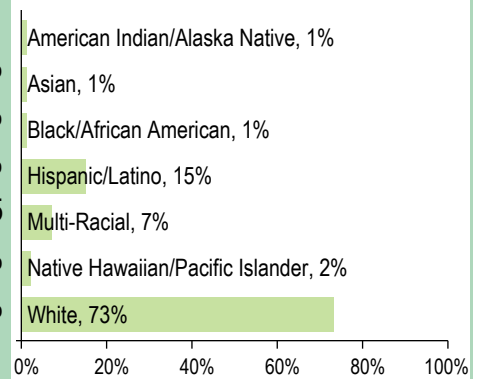

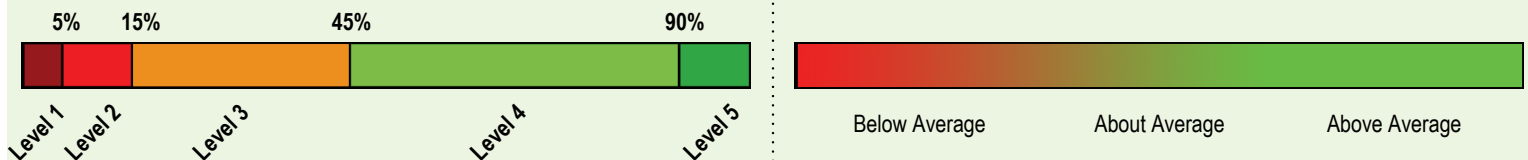
