

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2015-2016 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past two years. However, you will see rating levels for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth, and Student Group Growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed that about one third of Scott Elementary students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded the state standards in English Language Arts and approximately a sixth of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded the state math standards. These results show an improvement from the 2014-2015 results.

Scott Elementary staff are committed to meeting the needs of all students and are continuing to provide additional supports to students especially in English Language Arts and math. The English Language Arts growth of Scott Elementary students increased, when compared to other students in Oregon with similar prior test scores, while math growth remained steady.

These scores suggest that Scott Elementary students have transitioned well to the increased rigor within the Oregon state standards. Student Group Growth shows increased growth within all groups in the area of English Language Arts and steady growth within all groups in the area of math, both with the exception of students with disabilities. Improving the achievement of this group of students continues to be an important goal for Scott Elementary.

The Scott staff is committed to increasing the academic success of all students. Teachers have received additional training this past year in delivering reading curriculum and creating positive behavior supports. We appreciate the involvement of parents and our school community. Together we will ensure our students are prepared for college and career.

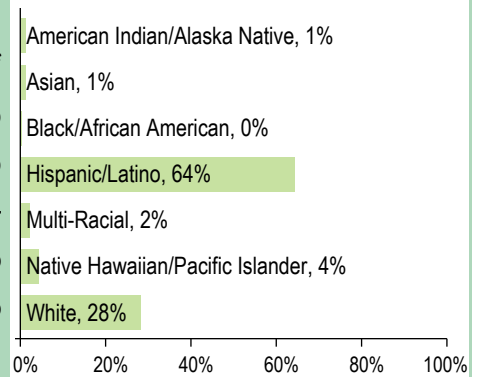

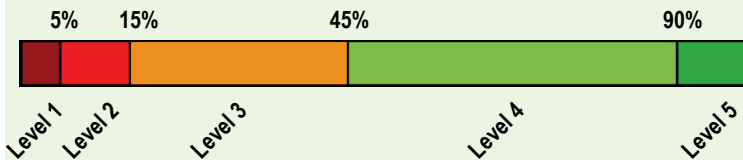
