In Literacy we will be continuing our implementation of the ReadyGen curriculum. In addition, we will be focusing on effective collaboration among

teachers through the use of the Data Teams process and improve our use of assessment data to provide targeted intervention for students who are needing additional support in meeting grade level standards. At Washington Elementary we promise to continue to grow and improve our practice to ensure all of our students meet benchmark standards.

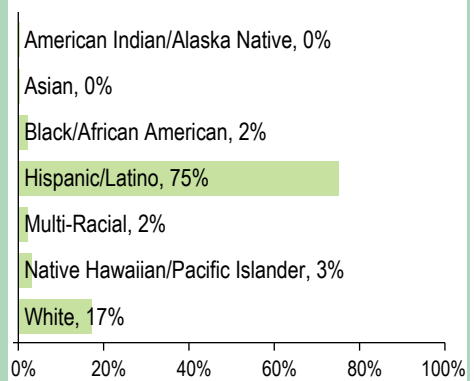

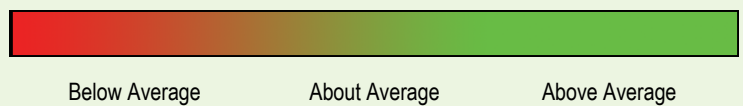
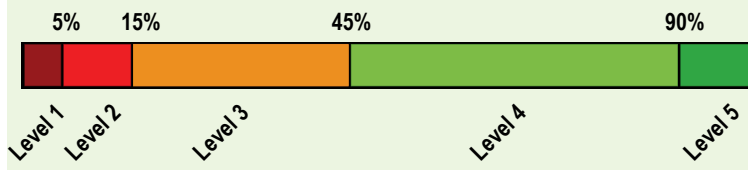
