Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-2017 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools this year due to transitioning to the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). However, you will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Sub-group growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed:

- 54.6% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards in English Language Arts
- 37.1% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards in Mathematics

As we continue to focus our efforts on increasing academic success for all of our students, Battle Creek teachers will continue to provide rigorous classroom instruction aligned to the Common Core State Standards in

reading, writing, and mathematics. Grade level teams will continue to meet weekly in data teams to monitor students' progress and will analyze student data to provide timely and targeted intervention for students as needed.

As always, I encourage you to stay involved with your child's education and be our partner. You can help by reading with your child every night, monitoring homework, attending parent-teacher conferences, volunteering and staying informed through calls, emails, newsletters and our parent club's face book page.

We look forward to partnering with you over the coming year to make sure all of our students demonstrate academic and social-emotional growth.

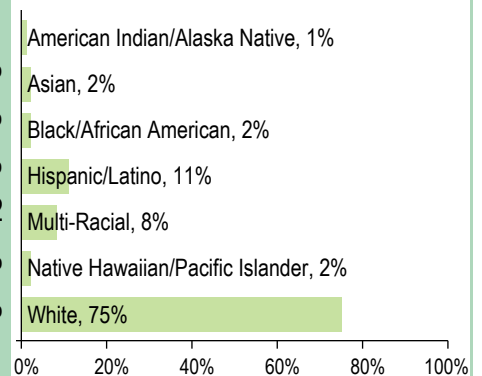
