## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-2017 school year, many students in the state completed the Smarter Balanced statewide assessments. Smarter Balanced assessments are more in-depth, going beyond standardized multiple-choice tests and have been aligned with the Common Core State Standards. The content standards set higher expectations for students, meaning the expectations for student achievement are higher than they used to be. As students continue to build on their skills with the common core state standards and their familiarity with the Smarter Balanced State Testing, results should improve as students have more years of instruction.

Based on the results report, Brush College Elementary reported:

- 58.4% of students met/exceeded state standards in Reading

- 48.7% of students met/exceeded state standards in Math

These percentages show an increase of 3.0% in Reading and an increase of 3.2% in Math from the previous school year.

As part of our efforts to increase academic success for all of our students and to provide targeted instruction for students K-5, our teachers have received additional training and will have on-going professional development to provide even higher quality instruction in our classrooms in lesson design, Common Core State Standards, reading, writing and mathematics. Our vision at Brush College is to support the needs of all of our students through intervention and enrichment opportunities.

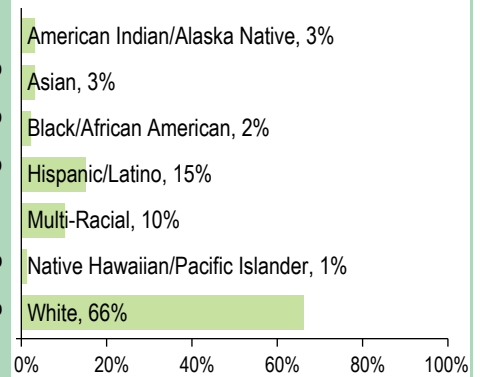
