During the 2016-17 school year, Claggett Creek Middle School students took the Math and English Language Arts “Smarter Balanced” statewide assessments also referred to as “SBAC”. This was the third year that our students have participated in these in-depth assessments that are based on common core state standards (CCSS). As a result of these assessments, our school received a level “3” score on Academic Achievement and scores of “4” on Academic Growth and Student Group Growth.

As an AVID National Demonstration School, Claggett Creek is committed to ensuring that all of our students graduate high school, ready for college or careers. Although we saw significant growth this year (see Student Group Growth Details), there is still a great deal of

work to be done to move all of our students forward in their learning.

We have chosen to address this need by continuing to implement a college and career readiness system using AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) strategies.

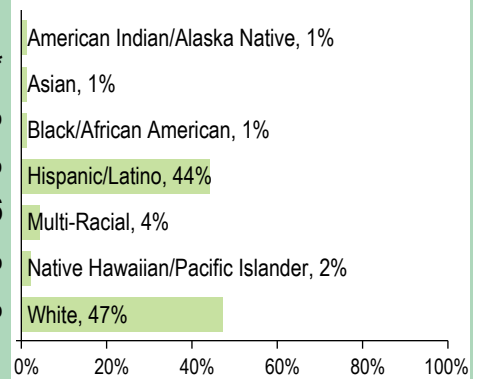
