

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-2017 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past three years. However, you will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Sub-group growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed:

- 45% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for reading
- 44% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state mathematics standards

The reading growth of Englewood students, when compared to other students in Oregon with similar prior test scores is the 60th percentile. The median growth in mathematics declined from 51st to 41st percentile.

In the 2016-2017 school year, the economically disadvantaged, English learners, students with disabilities and each of the historically underserved

subgroups met growth indicator ratings at an overall Level 4 in reading. This indicates that all our students are making growth in English Language Arts. All subgroups in math received a level 3 with the exception of English Learners, which was a Level 2. Maintaining our progress in English Language Arts will be a priority as we address the need to improve student success in math.

The Englewood staff is committed to increasing the academic success of all students. Teachers will receive additional training this year delivering curriculum and creating positive behavior supports in their classrooms. We appreciate the involvement of parents and our school community. Together we will ensure our students are prepared for success in college and careers.

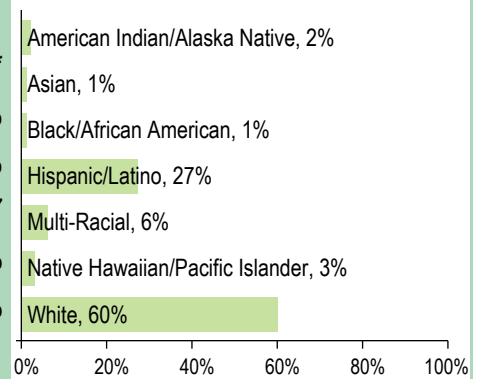
