Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-17 school year, students in Oregon took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past several years however, schools receive rating levels in three categories.

This year, Kalapuya has been given a 5 out of 5 rating for Academic Achievement and 4 out of 5 ratings for Academic Growth and Sub-Group Growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed:

- 71% of students in grades 3 – 5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts

- 64% of students in grades 3 – 5 met or exceeded state Mathematics standards

We progress monitor students' levels and provide intervention and support for students who are struggling and for students who are excelling. Our goal is to keep parents informed of their child's academic level and ways that they can support them at home. Together we can assure that all students make great academic growth each school year.

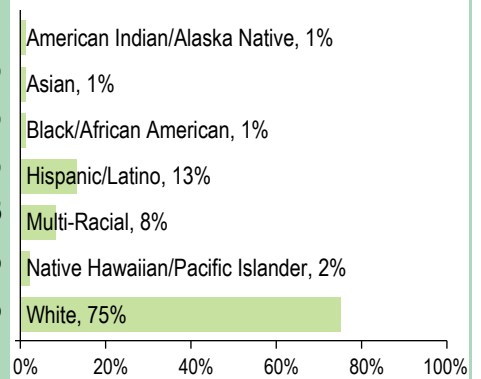
