## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-2017 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. No overall school rating levels have been assigned to Oregon schools for the past three years. However, you will see a rating level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Sub-Group Growth. Achievement based on the 2016-2017 Smarter Balanced Assessments showed:

- 32.9% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts
- 33.6% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state mathematics standards

Although the percentage of students meeting state academic standards decreased when measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessments, the math growth of Keizer Elementary students increased from the 51st percentile to the 52nd percentile. The 2016-2017 median growth for English Language Arts declined.

Improving the achievement of our subgroups has been an important goal for Keizer Elementary. Smarter Balanced Assessments for 2016-2017 showed improvement in the median growth for:

-English Language Learners – an increase in English Language Arts from 43rd percentile to 52nd percentile and in mathematics from 33rd percentile to 52nd percentile

-Students with Disabilities – an increase in English Language Arts from 51st percentile to 55th percentile and in mathematics from 38th percentile to 51st percentile

-Underserved Races/Ethnicities – an increase in English Language Arts from 44th percentile to 50th percentile and in mathematics from 47th percentile to 50th percentile

The Keizer Elementary staff is committed to increasing the academic success of all students. Teachers have received additional training the past year around delivering reading and math curriculum as well as creating positive behavior supports. We appreciated the involvement of parents and our school community. Together we will ensure our students are prepared for success in college and careers.

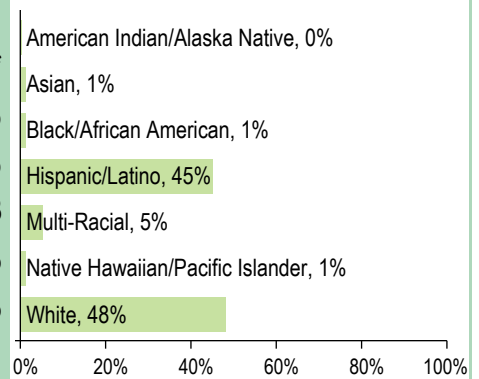

## CURRICULUM & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT WHAT IS THIS SCHOOL DOING TO IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE?

### SCHOOL READINESS

- There is a consistent positive behavior plan throughout the school
- Students participate in 120 minutes of physical education each week
- The attendance rate for Keizer Elementary students is 94%
- School counselors and school Behavior Specialist provide support for emotional, academic and behavioral needs
- Breakfast and lunch are provided to all students at no cost to families

### ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- Keizer Elementary provides an Early Exit program of Spanish language support for students Kindergarten – third grade
- Sheltered instruction and language development for speakers of other languages Kindergarten – fifth grade
- Federal Title programs provide supplemental academic support
- Individualized Educational Plans with appropriate language and academic supports are provided by Special Education staff for students with disabilities

### ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

- Individualized plans for enriched instruction are developed with parental input, for students identified as Talented and Gifted
- Focus on College and Career Readiness

- Keizer Elementary students in grade 5 provided opportunity to compete in the District Math 24 Challenge
