FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Kennedy is a wonderful school with amazing staff, students and parent community. We are always looking at improving each year. Therefore, Kennedy has developed a continuous improvement plan over the past year. The staff identified the following three focus areas for the 17-18 school year: 1) Enhancing a positive school climate & culture, 2) Implementing regular quality assessments, and 3) Utilizing high leverage instructional strategies.

During the 2016-2017 school year, all 3-5 grade students in the state took the Smarter Balanced statewide assessments (SBAC). These assessments measured reading, writing and math. The Smarter Balanced assessments are in-depth, going beyond a standardized multiple-choice test.

ODE is not assigning a summative 16-17 report card rating to schools because of the transition to the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Therefore, an overall state school report card rating is not noted on the Kennedy report card. Based on the student assessment results, Kennedy would have scored an overall level 4 rating out of a possible high rating of 5.

We are particularly proud of our student SBAC growth scores. Our 16-17 overall academic growth scores in both English language arts and math scored the highest rating possible - 5 out of 5. In addition, our 16-17 subgroup median growth percentile scores improved. We scored a 5 (the highest rating possible) in 9 out of the 12 subgroup categories. The remaining 3 subgroups received a score of 4 out of 5.

As part of our efforts to increase academic success for all of our students and to provide targeted instruction for students K-5, our teachers have received additional training this summer to provide even higher quality instruction in our classrooms in Common Core State Standards in reading, writing and math. We welcome your continued involvement from home and your support as an on-site volunteer at Kennedy. As always, we thank you for being involved in your child's education and for being partners with us to ensure our students are on the path to being college and career ready.

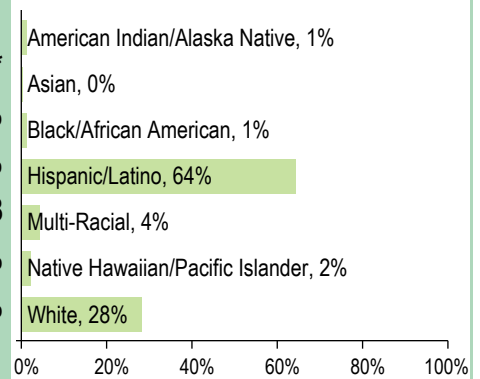

Performance of students enrolled in the school for a full academic year

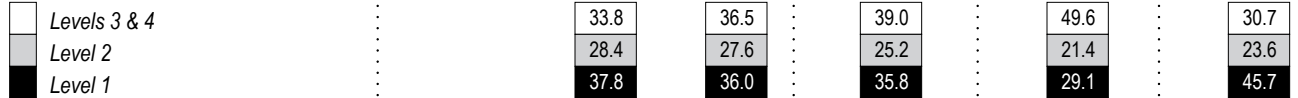

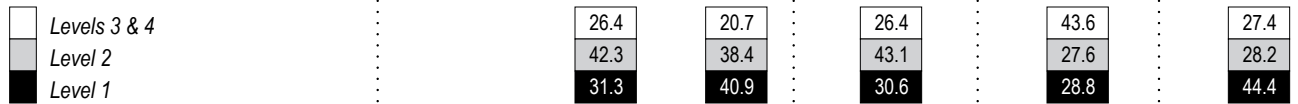

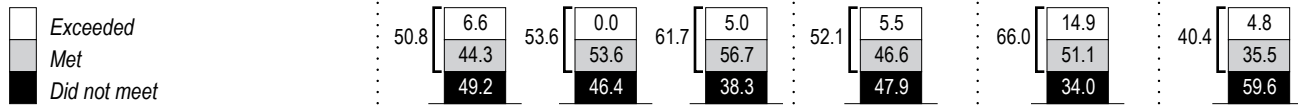
English Language Arts (Administered statewide in grades: 3-8, 11)
