Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-2017 school year our students took the Smarter Balanced assessment for the third time. Last year, only test scores were reported and performance indicators were given, however no overall school rating is given this year. Results reported:

Areas of Celebration:

- This year we did meet the participation targets
- Overall performance indicator for Academic Achievement was a 4

- Scored 3 in Academic Growth and Student Group Growth

Areas for Improvement:

- We dropped in our Academic growth from last school year
- Recommended improvement for English Language Learners in Language Arts and Math

As part of our efforts to increase academic success for all of our students and provide targeted instruction for students K-5, our teachers have received training on our new reading curriculum that is aligned with the State Common Core Standards and will receive continued support throughout the school year. Staff will also have continued support of an Instructional Coach and a Behavioral Specialist.

In the coming school year, we are excited to continue the work we have done in supporting math instruction and the work teachers have done in their Professional Learning Communities.

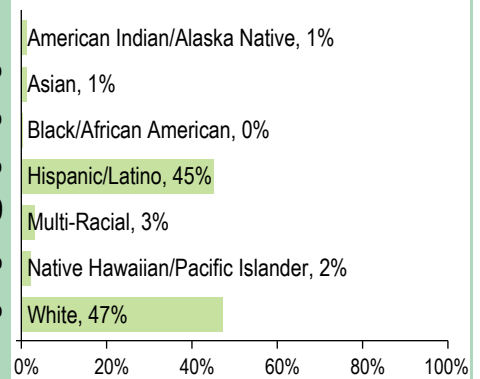
