FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-2017 school year, students had the opportunity to participate in the statewide Smarter Balanced assessments. The assessments are aligned to the new state standards.

This year the overall school rating was not assigned, but you will see school wide results in academic achievement, academic growth, student group growth, and participation results.

- 56.4% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for English Language Arts
- 53.4% of students in grades 3-5 met or exceeded state standards for Math
- Participation rate was 98.3% in English Language Arts and 97.1% in Math

Although the percentage of students meeting state academic standards decreased when measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessments, the Median

Growth Percentile of our underserved Races/Ethnicities in English Language Arts, increased from 44.5 the percentile to the 49th percentile and our Hispanic/Latino students' Median Growth Percentile increased from the 44.5th percentile to the 65th percentile.

Morningside staff is committed to every student's academic, social and emotional achievement. As part of our efforts to continue to increase academic success for all of our students and to provide targeted instruction, our teachers and support staff will continue to collaborate on instruction, provide differentiated instruction as well as intervention supports, and receive professional development to continue to improve our practices.

As always, we appreciate the involvement of parents and our school community. Together we will ensure our students are college and career ready.

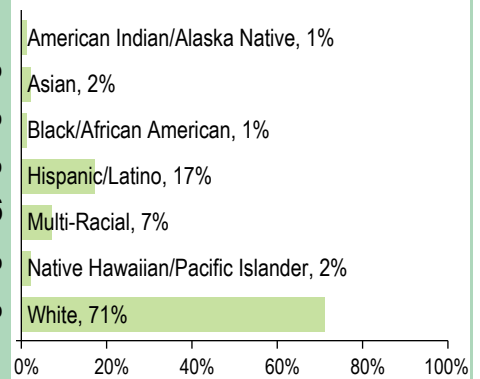
