Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-2017 school year, Oregon students in grades three, four, and five took the Smarter Balanced assessments in reading, writing, and math. Smarter Balanced assessments are more in-depth than standardized multiple choice tests, and are aligned with the new standards being taught.

No overall school rating levels were assigned to Oregon schools this year. You will find rating levels for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth, and Sub-group growth.

The number of students performing at or above grade level increased on the English Language Arts assessment last year, while there was a slight decrease in Math.

An area of celebration is the jump in growth for students with disabilities in the area of English Language Arts.

The staff at OLE is committed to increasing the academic success of ALL students. Teachers receive ongoing professional development in research-based strategies.

Classroom teachers provide differentiated instruction based on individual student need. Teachers collaborate in professional data teams to select priority standards, to create, implement, and analyze common formative assessments, and to provide scaffolding and interventions.

We appreciate the involvement of parents and our school community. You can support us by having your child read at home for at least 20 minutes every day. You can also help by monitoring your child's homework, attending parent-teacher conferences, and volunteering at the school. Limiting screen time and ensuring students arrive at school on time and well-rested will also make a substantial positive impact on their learning.

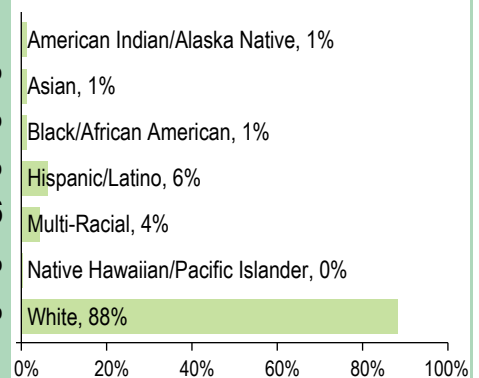
