Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-17 school year, students in Oregon again took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. You will see a ratings level for Academic Achievement, Academic Growth and Group Growth. Achievement based on the Smarter Balanced Assessments showed that Swegle Elementary School increased its overall academic rating from Level 1 to Level 2. This improvement was achieved through an increase in the median growth percentile of students in both English Language Arts and Math.

Due to the increase in median growth percentiles, Swegle students also improved achievement in both English Language Arts and Math. Overall achievement levels and student growth continue to be an area of focus, although the 2016-2017 data align more closely with like-schools across Oregon.

Improving the achievement of students with disabilities has been an important goal for Swegle Elementary School. Results show an improvement in growth for this population in both English Language Arts and Math.

The Swegle staff is committed to the academic and social growth of all students. Teachers have received additional training this past year in the areas of reading instruction, math best practices, and creating positive behavior supports. We appreciate the involvement and support of Swegle parents and our school community. Together, we are preparing our students for success in middle school and beyond.

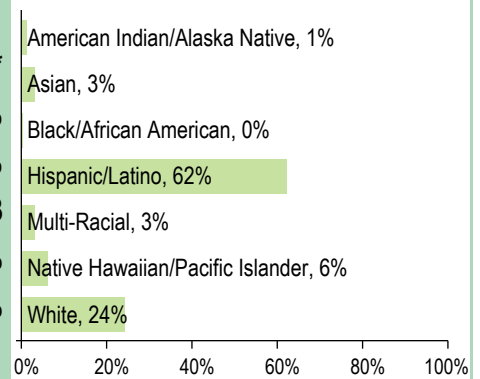

CURRICULUM & LEARNING ENVIRONMENT WHAT IS THIS SCHOOL DOING TO IMPROVE STUDENT LEARNING AND TO PREPARE STUDENTS FOR THE FUTURE?

SCHOOL READINESS

- Positive behavior interventions and supports (PBIS) that are school-wide and tiered to support student needs
- Students participate in 120 minutes of physical education each week
- A school counselor and behavior specialist provide support for emotional behavioral needs
- Programa Leyendo Avanzamos! for grades K and 1 Spanish-speaking students and their parents
- Jump Start Kindergarten for students starting kindergarten in the Fall
- Breakfast and lunch are provided to all students at no cost to families
- Community School Outreach Coordinator assists families with resources

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

- Federal Title programs provide supplemental academic support.
- Transitional bilingual instructional approach used to develop Spanish-English biliteracy.
- Use of sheltered language strategies such as Guided Language Acquisition Design to support English language development.
- Use of data to inform targeted and appropriate interventions.
- Individualized Educational Plans with appropriate language and academic supports are provided by Special Education staff for students with disabilities.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

- Rigorous instruction that prepares students for the next grade level
- Differentiated instruction for all students based on rate and level
- Assemblies and guest speakers that emphasize the arts and culture and that enhance learning
- Weekly access to library services, direct instruction in computer use, and music instruction

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES/ AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

- Student Leadership for grades 4 - 5 students
- Family events inclusive of all students
- Battle of the Books for students in grades 3 - 5
- Orchestra/Band for grade 4 - 5 students
- Choir for students in grades 3 - 5
- Outdoor school for grade 5 students
