Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2016-17 school year, students in grades 3, 4 and 5 took the Smarter Balanced Assessments. The students and staff at Faye Wright Elementary take great pride in the high level of academic achievement and growth demonstrated on our State Report Card. The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) will not assign overall school ratings to schools, but ODE will report ratings for indicators in the areas of academic achievement, academic growth as well as student group growth. Wright's ratings for Academic Achievement – Level 4, for Academic Growth – Level 5, and for Student Group Growth – Level 5, reflect the hard work and highly effective staff that make the learning of every student a priority. In the previous school year, each of the historically underserved subgroups met or exceeded growth indicator ratings. In the area of academic achievement, a priority for Wright will be to improve the achievement levels for our students with disabilities. This

will be an important goal for Wright in the 2017-18 school year. In addition, Wright will continue our efforts to increase academic success by providing additional supports in the areas of math and language arts, as well as providing professional development to teachers. We will continue to provide a positive school culture and climate and help teach and reinforce positive behavior and effective social skills. As always, we thank you for being involved in your child's education and for being partners with us to ensure our students are college and career ready. We welcome the support of the community and look forward to another great year at Faye Wright Elementary School!

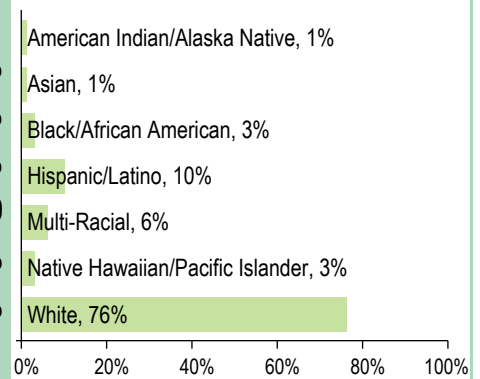
